Concert for Pacific Buddhist Academy Showcases a Tapestry of Traditions and Cultures

(HONOLULU) – Cultural diversity and traditions will be celebrated at a benefit concert for Pacific Buddhist Academy on Friday, December 5, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at Honpa Hongwanji Hawaii Betsuin's Main Hondo. Performances will include ancient music of the Japanese Imperial Court and traditional Indian dance.

Kinnara Gagaku is a musical ensemble which performs Gagaku music, introduced to Japan in the Nara period (697-794) from China along with Buddhism. Today, it is performed in Japan and the United States for audiences familiar and new to Gagaku, which literally



means *elegant* or *refined music*. It is the oldest continually played court music in the world. Bugaku, ceremonial dances performed in colorful costume accompanied by Gagaku music, will be a highlight of the event. Gagaku and Bugaku has been incorporated into Buddhist Services and rituals.

Arpana means *offering* in Sanskrit. The Arpana Dance Company, founded in 1982, is representative of India's diversity. Its dancers' heritages cover all parts of the country, from Kashmir in the north to Tamil Nadu in the south, but all have grown up as citizens of the United States.

Tickets for the concert are \$20, \$10 for students, and may be purchased at the Honpa Hongwanji Hawaii Betsuin Business Office at 1727 Pali Highway, or by calling 808-536-7044. Proceeds from the event will support PBA's Capital Campaign to build a new classroom facility.
