<u>Reverend Hiroo Kahara</u>, a former *Kaikyoshi* minister of Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii, passed away on August 9, 2016. The funeral service was held on August 12, 2016 at Genshōji Temple in Hyogo Prefecture. Rev. Hiroo Kahara had served Puunene Hongwanji Mission from September 1966 till February 1969, and Honomu, Honohina, and Papaaloa Hongwanji Missions from March 1969 till January 1972.

<u>Ms. Harue Furumoto</u>, a member of Honokaa Hongwanji Mission, passed away on July 5, 2016. The Posthumous Title (Ingo) of "Kon-Go-In" (金剛院) has been conferred from Bishop Eric Matsumoto upon Ms. Harue Furumoto for her contribution to Honokaa Hongwanji Mission and HHMH.

<u>Mrs. Haruko Hoashi</u> passed away on August 6, 2016. In recognition of Mrs. Haruko Hoashi's long years of dedication and commitment to nurturing students learning Japanese as a Japanese Language Teacher and the decades of support she provided her husband Reverend Shoin Hoashi as they both nurtured people of Jodo Shinshu Faith, the Posthumous Title (Ingo) of "Chō-Yō-In" (長養院) or "one who significantly dedicated herself to nurturing others" has been conferred upon her.

TOKUDO

Charlene Kihara (Hawaii Betsuin), Kerry Kiyohara (Moiliili Hongwanji), and Barbara Brennan (Hawaii Betsuin) recently returned from Japan as Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha priests.

Charlene, Kerry, Barbara, and six candidates from Buddhist Churches of America made up a group traveling to Kyoto in July to pursue the final steps for Tokudo Ordination. The candidates trained intensively for ten days with a schedule on most days going from 5:30 a.m. to 11 p.m., including services, classes and testing, cleaning, meals, changing robes, chanting, and practicing rituals.



Two other groups of candidates from Japan received training at the same time, making a total of 33 candidates.

On the ninth day, candidates were presented with their ordination certificates by Gomonshu Kojun Ohtani, the spiritual head of the Jodo Shinshu denomination. Candidates also received a Ki-Gesa (paneled priestly vestment) and a Homyo (Buddhist name). Several more services the following day and presentation of certificates in English completed the program.
