Birthday Gift from Takato

My birthday is January 10th. I was really grateful that birthday with a delicious cake during the January board meeting. *Arigato*! Speaking of birthday, we sometimes receive a gift. Since I was born 44 years ago, I cannot imagine how many birthday gifts and kind words I have received so far.



This year, I received a plastic model of a Japanese robot animation from Takato. I was pleased with the gift because it was one of my favorite robots in the animation. However, more than that, I was impressed that Takato personally gave me a birthday gift. He went to ACE Hardware in downtown Berkeley to buy it one day. The plastic model cost about \$40, which I think was a big purchase for a 13-year old boy. This 13-year old boy then nicely wrapped the box with wrapping paper. When I was a 13-year old boy, I didn't do such a thing! Above all, there was a feeling within himself that urged him to do so for his father. I received a box with a plastic model. However, since those thoughts came to my mind, my appreciation of the birthday gift from Takato became much deeper.

Buddhism teaches the truth of interdependence. Things exist because of innumerable causes and conditions behind the scene. Most people would agree with this analysis or observation. However, the point is not to intellectually comprehend it, but how it actually changes our everyday life. The story of my appreciation of Takato's birthday gift is one example.

We are members of the Berkeley Buddhist Temple. Thanks to many causes and conditions, especially those who made great contributions and efforts, we can have this temple building. For some people, it is just a building. However, when we become aware of things behind the scene, our appreciation of this temple building becomes greater and deeper. How about the statue of Amida Buddha of our temple? What kind of feeling did the artisan have in elaborately curving a piece of wood? Why has this beautiful statue been carefully preserved for over 500 years? What kind of Dharma message is this Amida Buddha statue telling us?

When we become aware of even a part of many causes and conditions of the things around us, we would see or appreciate them differently. This is one of the examples of how Buddhism leads us to cultivate our sense of gratitude or discover deeper meanings.


